MANAGER'S REPORT

I WOULD LIKE TO USE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO ADDRESS ANY CONCERNS YOU MAY HAVE ABOUT THE UPCOMING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT. THE ASSESSMENT WILL FUND RESERVES FOR 2023 TO ACCOMPLISH PROJECTS SCHEDULED FOR 2024, WHICH INCLUDE WINDOW REPLACEMENT, BUILDING PAINTING AND PAVEMENT RESEALING.

THE AMOUNT OF THE ASSESSMENT IS DETERMINED BY THE ESTIMATED COST IN THE RECENT RESERVE STUDIES. THE POOLED RESERVES ARE FUNDED WITH A PORTION OF THE MONTHLY ASSESSMENT,

IN AN ATTEMPT TO KEEP THE MONTHLY ASSESSMENT REASONABLE THERE WILL BE A DEFICIT OF RESERVE FUNDING WHICH MUST BE MADE UP WITH A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT.

THE BOARD WILL HOLD A WORKSHOP MEETING IN APRIL TO DECIDE THE AMOUNT AND DUE DATE OF THE ASSESSMENT. A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT APPROVAL MEETING WILL THEN BE HELD WITH A LIKELY MAY DATE.

SAFETY REPORT

WITH THE DELIGHTFUL WARM WEATHER AND SUNSHINE, OUR RESIDENTS AND GUESTS ARE ENJOYING OUR POOL AREA. HOWEVER, IF YOU HEAR THUNDER OR SEE LIGHTNING, PLEASE TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION TO LEAVE THE POOL AREA AND GO INSIDE!

IN JANUARY 2023, POLK COUNTY SHERIFF GRADY JUDD SHARED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION WITH OUR POLK COUNTY RESIDENTS:

RECENTLY, A COMPANY OUT OF FINLAND WHICH SPECIALIZES IN WEATHER AND ENVIRONMENTAL MEASUREMENTS PUBLISHED THEIR ANNUAL REPORT WHICH CONCLUDED THAT FLORIDA IS A HOTBED OF LIGHTNING ACTIVITY.

WHAT MAY COME AS A SURPRISE IS THAT THE FOUR CORNERS OF POLK COUNTY HAVE BEEN NAMED AS THE 2022 LIGHTENING CAPITAL OF THE UNITED STATES. THE FOUR CORNERS ARE WHERE POLK, ORANGE, LAKE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES MEET.

IN ADDITION, THE STATE OF FLORIDA, ENDED THE YEAR AT THE TOP SPOT FOR TOTAL LIGHTNING DENSITY WITH 285 LIGHTNING STRIKES PER SQUARE MILE, WHICH WAS UP 27% FROM THE YEAR BEFORE.

FLORIDA HAS LED THE NATION IN FATAL LIGHTNING STRIKES TWO YEARS IN A ROW WITH FOUR DEATHS IN 2021, AND THREE DEATHS IN 2020.

REMEMBER THAT LIGHTNING CAN START FIRES BY STRIKING HOMES, FIELDS AND WOODED AREAS. WE 'VE EVEN SEEN SEVERAL INCIDENTS OF VEHICLES BEING STRUCK WHILE TRAVELING DOWN THE HIGHWAY.

WHEN CONDITIONS ARE RIGHT FOR LIGHTNING, GET OUT OF THE WATER! NEVER STAND UNDER TREES OR NEAR THEM AND IMMEDI.
