Manager's Note

Window Project Update: April 2024

As outlined during the previous board meeting, the deposit payment has been successfully processed to Weather Tite Windows. Representatives from Weather Tite will soon visit Lakeridge to take precise measurements of the windows, enabling them to place the order with the manufacturer.

Anticipate 3 to 4 months for the arrival of the new windows at Lakeridge. Once the order is finalized and permitting is secured, a comprehensive project timeline will be provided to Lakeridge. Owners can expect to receive an information letter at least 30 days before the project begins, ensuring everyone is well-informed and prepared.
